Alpine & Snowboard Sessions:

Certified Level 1-3: By the end of the event, you will be able to apply learning experiences and connect fellow pros to the Performance Guide and assessment forms. Your clinic leader will tailor this clinic experience to the level of the audience. I.E., new hire, returning pro, certification candidate, etc.

RMT: Designed for those who have passed the entrance assessment and are in the RMT process. Your clinic leader will tailor this clinic experience to those focused on completing the process.

Examiner 1 Development: The 2022 E1 clinic is for current RMTs. If you are considering applying for

the job as a Rocky Mountain Examiner, check out this 2-day clinic with qualified RM Staff.



Children's Sessions:

Path to Children's Ed Staff: For current Level 3 Instructors, RMTs, CRMTs and those studying for CRMT with the goal of eventually joining Children's Ed Staff. Enjoy a day working with your peers to explore and practice the skills demonstrated by successful CRMT candidates and Children's Ed Staff applicants.

CS1 and CS2 rollout of all that is NEW! Join this clinic to discover what is new with our National Children's Specialist Standards, the Performance Guide, Assessment Forms, and processes for both the CS1 and the CS2.

Adaptive Sessions:

Time spent unpacking the 2022 PSIA-AASI National Adaptive Alpine Certification Standards will help managers and trainers better understand the Standards document, how the Standards are being implemented in RM this season, and ways to use the Standards as school training tools.

We also plan to explore an alternative snowsports device and its application in adaptive lessons, how to work with Resort management to gain approval for on-snow use and investigate modifications to meet various needs of lesson guests with disabilities.



Telemark Sessions:

This clinic will start with what's new in Telemark and the National Standards changes that will be integrated for the first time this season. We will look into the process of Telemark certification in the RM region, the offerings we have and how this compares across all of PSIA-AASI. We will also look at how

our Telemark education and certification is the same as other discipline processes and can complement any discipline. And lots of skiing!

Freestyle Session:

After attending the Freestyle Clinic day of MSM, trainers will be ready to use the National Standards, Performance Guide, and Unified Assessment forms as tools to help prepare instructors for assessments and teaching lessons. All of the new or adjusted freestyle resources can feel overwhelming in text format. Practicing using these resources on snow will allow us to connect the text with experiences.



Directors Session:

Building off our Spring meeting in Vail, we will not only elaborate on the direction we are headed as an education body, we will offer a venue in which you, our school directors, can discuss issues relevant to your role in the industry. Sharing insight to your experiences and initiatives is invaluable to one another and how cool is it that we can do that 30' in the air on a chairlift!

Bonus/ Add-on Sessions:

Nov 12: Technical Foundations: This session focuses on the technical aspects of contemporary skiing and the practical application of Movement Analysis models. Participants will have the opportunity to hone their technical understanding through group discussion as well as time spent viewing movement patterns, developing error-detection skills and cause & effect relationships and formulating lesson plans for skiers viewed from video.

Nov 13: Boot Balancing & Alignment: This equipment-oriented clinic will focus on balancing and alignment issues for all skiers. Participants will explore biomechanics, equipment considerations (footbeds, canting, boot/binding features, etc.), and individual skier characteristics and alignment aspects. Participants will learn to identify how alignment affects ski and body performances.
