Snowboard Freestyle Level 2/3 Specialist

Process Overview:

This is a three-day event. The first day being a clinic and then the next two days the exam. With successful completion of this assessment the candidate will achieve the level 2 or 3 Freestyle Specialist qualification. The candidate will be asked what level they would like to be assessed at.

Exam Prerequisites

- PSIA/AASI Membership
- Snowboard Freestyle Specialist 1 or Snowboard Level 2 certified with confidence of terrain park features

Exam Process (Three day process)

- 1 day clinic (focused on freestyle teaching, MA and riding improvement)
- 1 day Freestyle teaching and MA assessment
- 1 day Freestyle riding assessment

Description

This is a three-day process in which the group will spend the first day training on all aspects of the exam. This day will focus on improving your freestyle riding at the level of the level 2 or 3 specialist assessment standard. You will also work on the teaching progressions and MA skills needed to be a level 2 or 3 specialist freestyle instructor. On Day 2 your teaching and movement analysis skills will be assessed. Then on the third and final day your riding abilities will be assessed.

To attain any freestyle specialist level, a candidate must successfully meet the standards of Instruction, Movement Analysis and Riding Skills. Concepts, skills and ideas from the candidate's previous certifications should be shown throughout the evaluation process regardless of the situation.
