Snowboard Tricks of the Trees

Duration (Hours/CEUs)

2 days / 12 CEUs

Learning Connection Highlight

Teaching Skills, People Skills, Technical Skills

Course Description

Take your basic riding skills from the groomers into the trees with tactics for teaching and exploring this type of terrain with students. You will ride terrain that will develop solid skills for being confident and comfortable riding in the trees, selecting tree runs, and managing your lesson in the tree environment.

Recommended Preparatory Learning or Prerequisites

- Comfortable on a variety of blue terrain

Prerequisite Course(s) and Skills

- Snowboard Level 1 Certified

Learning Outcomes

By the end of this clinic, successful participants will be able to:

- Take your basic riding skills from the groomers into the trees
- Tactics for teaching and exploring this type of terrain with students
- Riding other types of terrain that will develop solid skills for being confidence and comfortable riding in the trees
- Selecting tree runs and class handling in the tree environment

Learning Experiences

- Ice breaker exercises to build rapport among the group and expose a variety of information useful for future exercises.
- Play and drills exploring movement and riding styles both in and out of the trees, on and off of the groomed runs
- Riding time with direct feedback from peers and clinic leader

- Appropriate riding gear to be on snow both days
- Helmets are required



Snowboarding 201

Duration (Hours/CEUs)

1 or 2 days / 6 or 12 CEUs

Learning Connection Highlight

Technical Skills, Teaching Skills, People Skills

Course Description

This 1 or 2-day clinic is your opportunity to review information relative to the Level 2 exam across MA, Teaching, and Riding elements. These are participant driven sessions - come prepared with specific criteria you're looking to develop or seek feedback on!

Improve your riding skills and versatility with riding, coaching, and feedback. Level 2 riding activities may be used to develop skills while applying the tasks to a variety of terrain and conditions.

Preview the Level 2 movement analysis requirements as you prepare for certification. You will be given feedback where you currently stand in the national exam standard for movement analysis and the technical applications of teaching levels 5-7.

Explore the Level 2 teaching standards as you prepare for your Level 2 Instruction certification exam.

Recommended Preparatory Learning or Prerequisites

- Review Level 2 Assessment Forms
- Review Level 2 Performance Guide
- Comfortable on a variety of intermediate and advanced terrain.
- Participants should have experience working with intermediate students and be actively training towards their Level 2 Certification.
- These are participant driven sessions - come prepared with specific criteria you're looking to develop or seek feedback on!

- Snowboard Level 1 Certification

Learning Outcomes

- Participants will gain a clearer picture of the movements and skills that can be developed to move towards attaining the Level 2 riding standard.
- Participants will gain a clearer picture of their ability to observe, describe and analyze board performance and body movements.
- Participants will gain a clearer picture of their ability to develop successful lessons utilizing progression building within the teaching model.



Learning Experiences

- The riding tasks used for riding feedback and improvement, movement analysis, and technical understanding practice sessions will be selected from the *National Riding Activity List*.
- Observe the clinic leader analyze riding performance of participants.
- Clinic Leader provides guided practice for participants analyzing riding performance of a peer performing a predetermined intermediate-level riding task from the *National Riding Activity List*.
- Clinic leader provides guided practice for participants comparing their riding performance of a predetermined intermediate-level riding task with the desired performance.
- Clinic leader may demonstrate building a teach from group observation.
- Clinic leader provides participants opportunities to assess peers and develop teaching segments.
- Discussions, reflections of analyses, and exploration of technical topics as needed.

Snowboard All Mountain Freestyle

Duration

1 day / 6 CEUs

Course Description:

This clinic is a fun and mind opening experience on how to ski/ride the whole mountain with a freestyle view and mentality. This clinic is ideal for anyone wanting to learn about teaching freestyle outside the park.

Participants will learn how to teach freestyle using a variety of terrain and how to incorporate freestyle into their all mountain riding/skiing. This clinic will enhance your alpine/snowboard skill sets by expanding your knowledge of functional movement patterns for specific outcomes. The clinician will help you build your confidence while working through new challenges and ideas, which will deepen your mountain experience and expand your teaching options.

Prerequisites Courses and Skills:

- PSIA/AASI Alpine/Snowboard Level 1 Certification

Course Objectives:

By the end of this clinic, successful participants will be able to:

- Demonstrate freestyle applications in an all-mountain environment
- Demonstrate how to build freestyle progressions to enhance teaching
- Collaborate on how to help promote learning of new skills through freestyle
- Describe how to apply freestyle terminology and tactics in the all-mountain environment.

Learning Outcomes:

- Apply the A.T.M.L. model to various types of terrain
- Build S.A.S.C. (static, active, simple, complex) progressions and explore how different types of terrain can be incorporated into progressions.
- Explore how the application of Speed, POP, and Spin changes in different types of terrain and conditions
- Practice how to safely set up session environments outside the park and how Park Smart is relevant to all mountain snowboarding/skiing.
- Practice freestyle techniques and tricks and have participants receive feedback on desired body performance and ski performance.

1 or 2 days / 6 or 12 CEUs

Technical Skills, Teaching Skills, People Skills

Course Description

This 1 or 2-day clinic is your opportunity to review information relative to the Level 3 exam across MA, Teaching, and Riding elements. These are participant driven sessions - come prepared with specific criteria you're looking to develop or seek feedback on!

Improve your riding skills and versatility with riding, coaching, and feedback. Level 3 riding activities may be used to develop skills while applying the tasks to a variety of terrain and conditions.

Preview the Level 3 movement analysis requirements as you prepare for certification. You will be given feedback where you currently stand in the national exam standard for movement analysis and the technical applications of teaching levels 8-9.

Explore the Level 3 teaching standards as you prepare for your Level 3 Instruction certification exam.

- Review Level 3 Assessment Forms
- Review Level 3 Performance Guide
- Comfortable on a variety of intermediate and advanced terrain.
- Participants should have experience working with advanced students and be actively training towards their Level 3 Certification.

Snowboarding 401 Trainer Workshop

Duration (Hours/CEUs)

1 or Days / 6 or 12 CEUs

Learning Connection Highlight

Technical Skills, Teaching Skills, People Skills

Course Description

This 1 or 2-day clinic is your opportunity to review information relative to the Snowboard Trainer assessment across MA, Teaching, and Riding elements. These are participant driven sessions - come prepared with specific criteria you're looking to develop or seek feedback on! Trainer Workshops may include tasks, progressions, skills, and learnings from any level of certification, on any exam terrain, forward or switch. Your clinician will work with the group to determine specific goals and skills to develop based on participants' needs, available terrain and features, and snow/weather conditions.

Clinic & Presentation Skills: This clinic will workshop Clinic and Presentation skills at the Trainer level. The workshop is designed to introduce you to the Trainer standard and develop clinic and presentation skills through pre-work, on-snow practice, feedback, and self-assessment. Clinic & Presentation 401 Trainer Workshop counts as a prerequisite for the Snowboard Trainer exam and will help you learn where to focus your training as a candidate or trainer at your resort.

MA & Tech Skills: This clinic will workshop Movement Analysis and Technical skills at the Snowboard Trainer level. The workshop is designed to introduce you to the Rocky Mountain Trainer standard and develop MA and Technical skills through pre-work, on-snow practice, feedback, and self-assessment. MA & Tech 401 Trainer Workshop counts as a prerequisite for the Snowboard Trainer exam and will help you learn where to focus your training as a Snowboard Trainer candidate or trainer at your resort.

Riding Skills: This clinic will workshop Riding skills at the Snowboard Trainer level. The workshop is designed to introduce you to the Snowboard Trainer standard and develop your riding through pre-work, on-snow practice, feedback, and self-assessment. Ride 401 Trainer Workshop counts as a prerequisite for the Snowboard Trainer exam and will help you learn where to focus your training as a Snowboard Trainer candidate or trainer at your resort.



Recommended Preparatory Learning or Prerequisites

- Complete the Snowboard Trainer Clinic & Presentation 401 Clinic Builder clinic outline (available at PSIA-RM.org), and come prepared to present your clinic on snow.
- Come prepared with at least one video on your phone of a rider that you are familiar with and can talk to changes they have made or are working on.
- Come prepared with documented feedback (written, videos, text messages, etc) of at least two specific riding tasks. This could be from a trainer you're working with, a peer or supervisor or manager, or with your own self-assessment.
- Participants should have experience working with advanced students and be actively training towards their Level 3 Certification.
- These are participant driven sessions - come prepared with specific criteria you're looking to develop or seek feedback on!

Prerequisite Course(s) and Skills

- Snowboard Level 3 Certification
- Snowboard Level 2 Certified with Letter of Recommendation from Ski School Director / Training Manager

Learning Outcomes

- Participants will gain a clearer picture of the movements and skills that can be developed to move towards attaining the Snowboard Trainer riding standard.
- Participants will gain a clearer picture of their ability to observe, describe and analyze board performance and body movements of peer instructors.
- Participants will gain a clearer picture of their ability to deliver prepared and impromptu clinics.

Learning Experiences

- Observe the clinic leader analyze riding performance of participants.
- Clinic Leader provides guided practice for participants analyzing riding performance of a peer performing a predetermined instructor-level riding task from the *National Riding Activity List*.
- Clinic leader provides guided practice for participants comparing their riding performance of a predetermined instructor-level riding task with the desired performance.
- Deliver your prepared clinic and receive feedback from clinic leader and peers.
- Clinic leader provides participants opportunities to deliver impromptu clinics on assigned topics.
- Discussions, reflections of analyses, and exploration of technical topics as needed.
