**Scoring Criteria for Level 1**  
1: Essential elements were not observed or not present.  
2: Essential elements are beginning to appear.  
3: Essential elements appear, but not with consistency.  
4: Essential elements appear regularly at a satisfactory level.  
5: Essential elements appear frequently, above required level.  
6: Essential elements appear continuously, at a superior level.
