



## **Snowboard Level 3 Preview Clinic**

The Snowboard Level 3 Preview Clinic is designed to introduce you to the Level 3 Certification standard and help you learn where to focus your training.

Snowboard Level 3, also known as “full cert,” is the highest level of national PSIA-AASI certification. At the Level 3, you’re expected to demonstrate experience with high-level students, show mastery of snowboard instruction concepts, and apply your knowledge and skill to situations on-snow and indoors. At the Level 3, you should be able to teach or ride anything, anytime, anywhere.

## **Snowboard Level 3 Instruction Preview**

Preview the Level 3 exam standards and exam teaching requirements as you prepare for your Level 3 Instruction certification exam. You will be given feedback where you currently stand in the national exam standard for instruction and the technical applications of teaching levels 8 & 9. Participants will gain a clearer picture of their ability to develop successful advanced level lessons utilizing MA and progression building within the teaching model. Your Divisional Educator will recommend further training through additional sessions to aid in your development.

## **Snowboard Level 3 Ride Preview**

Preview the Level 3 exam standards and exam riding task requirements as you prepare for your Level 3 Riding certification exam. You will be given feedback where you currently stand in the national exam standard for riding free-ride, freestyle, and specific tasks at levels 8 & 9. Participants will gain a clearer picture of the movements and skills that can be developed to move towards attaining the L3 riding standard. Your Divisional Educator will recommend further training through additional sessions to aid in your development.

## **Snowboard Level 3 MA Preview**

Preview the Level 3 exam standards and movement analysis requirements as you prepare for certification. You will be given feedback where you currently stand in the national exam standard for movement analysis and the technical applications of teaching levels 8 & 9. Participants will gain a clearer picture of their ability to accurately observe, describe and analyze advanced board performance and body movements.
