Alpine On-Snow Clinic Choices:

Creative Teaching: Expand your bag of tricks. In this on-snow clinic we will pick an outcome and explore different ways we can teach it.

Skiing Fundamentals: This session will focus on developing your understanding of how to use the PSIA Alpine Fundamentals from the National Standards to develop your skiing and evaluate others.

Peer Movement Analysis: Develop your movement analysis skills and develop strategies for peer level coaching.

Alpine Examiner | Development:

*You must be a current RMT to attend this event. In this two day clinic you will develop the ability to create objectives based on the GCT[™] model, develop the ability to facilitate objectives at a peer level, receive feedback in skill based demonstrations and versatility and have scoring practice.
