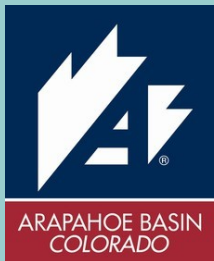

Keynote Wed. Nov. 10, 6PM Online

Optimizing Snowsports Instruction - Dr. Gabriele Wulf and Dr. Rebecca Lewthwaite will talk about the three key factors in their OPTIMAL Theory. Enhanced expectancies or confidence, autonomy, and an external focus of attention. They'll give examples of how they can be implemented in practical settings (e.g., snowsports).

Alpine On-Snow Clinics:

Based on your group's feedback, your group will cover the changes to Alpine Levels 1, 2, 3 and/or Rocky Mountain Trainer (RMT) process that you need to know to train instructors for certification. This season's clinics will primarily focus on adjustments made to the Level 2 and Level 3 certification process, as well as focus on how the Technical, Teaching, and People Skills Fundamentals and the Performance Guide are being applied in the exam.

Children's Multi Discipline Clinics

CRMT Monday: For current RMTs, CRMTs and those studying for CRMT with the goal of eventually joining Children's Ed Staff. Enjoy a day working with your peers to discover and practice the skills it takes to pass the CRMT process and be hired onto Children's Ed Staff. Come with your questions about the process, skills and/or models that you wish to practice or observe in this supportive environment.

Kids Tuesday Clinic: CS1 and CS2 rollout of all that is NEW! Join this clinic to discover what is new with our National Children's Standards, our new Performance Guide, our new Assessment Forms, and our new processes for both the CS1 and the CS1.

Freestyle Alpine Clinics

The first half of the day will be spent continuing to ski through the Training and Development Guide and developing your own understanding of the new National Standards. The second half of the day will be focused on freestyle.

By the end of the session you will be ready to train fellow pros for the new FS1 MA process. Explore how ATML can be applied in all freestyle areas and how to set up effective learning experiences for developing freestyle skill sets.

Snowboard On-Snow Clinics:

This Resort Trainer and Manager focused version of the Certification Update clinic will cover the changes to Snowboard Levels 1, 2, 3 and RMT process that you need to know to train instructors for certification. This season's clinics will primarily focus on adjustments made to the Level 2 and Level 3 certification process, as well as focus on how the Technical, Teaching, and People Skills Fundamentals and the Performance Guide are being applied in the assessment. Attendees will discuss current and future changes to assessment format and tasks, ride through new and changed tasks, and experience the Teach and MA formats. Participants will gain a better understanding of the current assessment candidate experience and how to better prepare and train instructors for exams. Alpine participants are welcome.

Adaptive On-Snow Clinics

This clinic is intended for Adaptive Administrators, Managers, and Trainers who want to receive updated information on all adaptive educational and assessment products offered this season; assessment process changes, and instructor preparation for adaptive lessons and assessments. We will also explore alternative snowsports devices and their application in adaptive lessons and how to work with Resort management to gain approval for on-snow use. A new look at last seasons' COVID Playbook will offer the opportunity for all present to share lessons learned in 2021 and together investigate modifications that may made to be made to meet variable needs this winter.

Freestyle Snowboard Clinics

AM- The morning will be focused on getting on snow and discussing individual strengths and weaknesses within the group. We will then use this information to give individual feedback at the same time discuss and illustrate the differences between doing MA on freestyle tricks vs turns.

PM- This is where the updates for the FS-1 and some of the other new offerings that the freestyle committee has produced over the summer. There will be examples of passing and non-passing teaching and riding for the FS-1 in an effort to standard bring the standard to life. There will also be time to discuss freestyle training at your own resort with limited features.
